We have been thinking for some time about ways to publicise the Society and the Kingston pub on Trinity Square where we hold our social meetings. Landlords Mark and Lisa have been very good to us over the years. If you have been there you may have noticed the big flagpole above the door facing the square. We wondered about having the Society flag flown from it. At the moment the square is in total upheaval as they get ready for the City of Culture 2017.

The Square and Holy Trinity Church is going to be a real focal point for the celebration of the arts and the City of Hull. The Kingston pub is in a prime spot to benefit from this. We had been wondering about how we could refurbish the flagpole as there is no halyard at the moment.

In the end, with the permission of Mark and Lisa, we contacted Marston's Brewery and met the local representative. We outlined what we wanted and argued that it would be good for the pub as well as the Society. The local 'area manager' saw the potential and agreed to pass this on to the next level. I'm not sure whether that is the recycling bin, but we will follow it up and hopefully will have more to report soon. We already have a flag to fly and it would be good to see it flying from such a handsome flagpole as the one at the Kingston Hotel pub.



The old United Towing Offices on Nelson Street are now owned by a law firm that specialises in marine matters. Society member Nev Gray contacted them following a local history open day, to see if they would be interested in having a commemorative plaque. The partners of the firm Myton Law agreed and the wheels were put in motion. The plaque has been produced and looks magnificent. We are now trying to set a date for the handover. It will only be visible when inside the offices, but we are hoping that the presentation will make the press.

Job van Eijk, the editor, has been extremely helpful and will also introduce us to other societies and publications that will spread our cause even further.



At the very beginning of the 'official' Society we sought a grant to help us set the ball rolling. Hull Community and Voluntary Services were very helpful in guiding us along the route of writing a constitution etc and also in sourcing the initial funding. We applied for, and obtained £150 from the Sir James Reckitt Fund. You will all have heard of James Reckitt of Reckitt and Coleman but maybe not know that he set this charity up in 1921 for the public benefit, especially the people of Hull and East Yorkshire. He built libraries and was the first President of the Sailors' Children's Society. He died in 1924. We have to submit a report on how we have used the grant and how it has assisted to meet our aims and objectives. If they consider we haven't used it wisely they can ask for it back! I'm sure they will find us well ready for a busy second year.
